Welcome and catch up!	Weeth: Following on from previous discussion with Chartwells where Weeth requested to have more ketchup (and learning that we couldn't do this due to the ingredients of standard ketchup). Chartwells update	At Weeth, Chartwells worked with Lizzie and Jacob to bring the healthy ketchup recipe to life. Last week, the ketchup was made in Weeth and teachers and children taste tested. The comparison with 'normal' ketchup was made and the healthy ketchup was a definite winner!  Carl the chef will be making sure that the recipe for the ketchup is known in all Crofty kitchens.  The new ketchup – 'Jazzie's' will be in all Crofty schools from October   Next week, Chartwells will be in Rosemellin working with Henry on a fajita recipe. Henry took his tomato sauce home that he made at the summit (from wonky vegetables) and used it to make fajitas with his family. He shared this with Carl and Karen and they are going to Rosemellin to make the fajita recipe together. From October, Henry's Fajitas will be on Crofty school menus!  Amazing! Thank you so much to our Warriors at Weeth and Rosemellin and a huge thank you to Carl and Karen for making this happen!
Recycling update	Mrs Collins gave us an update from Biffa Our plan and hope was to increase the proportion of our waste that we are recycling. All schools have achieved this aim! Well done everybody. Trannack and Porthleven have requested some recycling bins. Please let Mrs Collins know if you need more recycling bins.

At Rosemellin, litter picking has been happening regularly. Rubbish is being collected with litter pickers and Crofty Warriors are making sure that any rubbish that is recyclable is being recycled. At Treloweth, year 6 have been using litter pickers to clear the field well so that it is clean and safe for all the children to use as the weather gets better. At Portreath, children are recycling used pens. Please ask Mrs Pamplin if you want information on how to do this. A few of our schools have been using the recyclable glue sticks. These are working well 😊 At Roskear, fashion fixers have made sure that any spare or used uniform is being washed and laundered - clean used uniform is being handed out free of charge. At Sithney, the warriors have been really busy. They have shared the eco-heroes around the school, made sure everyone is using re-usable bottles and have energy saving initiatives to make sure that lights and projectors are turned off when not in use. They also have a uniform shop set up! Sustainability Coming soon! curriculum Teachers in all our schools met in February on their inset day to start designing a Trust climate change and sustainability curriculum. A working party has used this information and created a curriculum for everyone to use! Every Crofty school will be having a sustainability curriculum week in the summer 2 half term. We will collect pictures and examples of work that is going on and share it so we can see what everyone is learning and use it to make the curriculum even better next year!
