	Water Wizard: We pledge to use reusable water bottles to drink from in school
	Fashion Fixer: We pledge to set up a uniform swap shop, donating back our old uniform for smaller children to take for free.
	Veggie Vindicator: We pledge to work with our school caterers to ensure our menu helps
	to reduce the impact on the climate
	Fume Fighter: We pledge o do a whole school challenge to walk, scoot or bike to school, reducing the use of cars
	<b>Truth Talker:</b> We pledge to have a monthly update in assemblies and on the school's newsletter with the school's climate achievements
	Energy Expert: We pledge to reduce our energy consumption for the school using our smart technology to monitor
	<b>Green Guide:</b> We pledge to work with our school cooking team to raise awareness of wonky fruit and vegetables
	Recycle Ranger: We pledge to make sure that the school has recycling bins and that we are reducing our general waste to landfill
	A reminder that in our meetings, we always have time to listen to what schools have been doing to try and reduce their impact on the environment.
	Last year, along with ensuring that we were meeting our core pledges, we also spent a lot of time focusing on trying to reduce our environmental footprint through the
	choices we make about food. We worked with Chartwells to look at reducing our food miles and using wonky vegetables that might otherwise be thrown away. This was
	hugely successful - Henry's (Rosemellin) fajita recipe (made from a sauce of wonky
	vegetables) is now on Chartwells' menus in over 2500 schools across the country!
	Jazzie's (Weeth) ketchup is now on the menu in 1000 schools across the country!
	Amazing stuff!!

	Our real focus this year is on biodiversity. We will be looking at local habitats and how we can take good care of them but also thinking about how we can encourage others to take care of them too. Our annual summit this year will be forest school themed.  We had lots of questions about the dates for various things throughout this year. Mrs Collins has sent out a list of all the key dates. We will send this out again to Headteachers and the Crofty Warrior adult email group so please double check to see if they have received it
